### Internship Program Admissions

<p><b>Indian Health Care Resource Center of Tulsa, Inc.:</b> Interns will provide outpatient psychological services to the American Indian community. The services completed by interns include psychotherapy, psychological assessment, consultation, and community outreach.</p>
<p><b>Laureate Institute for Brain Research (LIBR):</b> Interns will split their time between the Laureate Psychiatric Clinic and Hospital (LPCH) and LIBR. At LPCH, interns will provide inpatient psychological services to adults admitted to the LPCH acute psychiatric unit and to individuals admitted to the Eating Disorder psychiatric unit. Additionally, at LPCH, interns will provide intensive outpatient services to individuals receiving treatment for a variety of mental health symptoms and/or chemical dependency. At LIBR, interns will participate in ongoing psychotherapy clinical trials and research activities.</p>
<p><b>Oklahoma Forensic Center:</b> Interns will provide psychological services to two inpatient forensic populations, individuals found Not Guilty for Reason of Mental Illness and individuals found Not Competent to Proceed in court. The services completed by interns include forensic assessment, generalist assessment, individual therapy, group psychotherapy, and competency restoration groups.</p>
<p><b>The University of Tulsa Counseling and Psychological Services:</b> Interns will provide outpatient psychological services to the University of Tulsa's student body. The services completed by interns include counseling, psychological assessment, and psychoeducational workshops and programs.</p>
<p><b>Cherokee Nation Behavioral Health:</b> Interns will provide outpatient psychological services to individuals belonging to the Cherokee Nation and other federally recognized tribes. The services completed by interns include individual and group therapy, assessment, crisis management, and program development.</p>
